

#### Muscular Dystrophy - Definition by Mayo Clinic Staff

Muscular dystrophy is a group of diseases that cause progressive weakness and loss of muscle mass. In muscular dystrophy, abnormal genes (mutations) interfere with the production of proteins needed to form healthy muscle.

There are many different kinds of muscular dystrophy. Symptoms of the most common variety begin in childhood, primarily in boys.

The most common and severe form of MD among children is Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy (DMD). Duchenne Muscular Dystrophy accounts for more than 50% of all cases. DMD appears typically in boys between ages 3 and 5 and progresses rapidly. Most people with DMD are unable to walk by age 12 and may later need a respirator to breathe. They usually die in their late teens or early 20s from heart trouble, respiratory complications, or infection.

#### **Camp Promise - The Jett Foundation**

Since 2001, the Jett Foundation, has worked to find treatments and a cure for Duchenne muscular dystrophy (DMD) while improving the lives of those affected by it. The foundation is the parent organization for Camp Promise, an advocacy services for families affected by Duchenne.

The mission of Camp Promise is to provide a barrier-free, weeklong overnight camp for kids, teens, and adults with muscular dystrophy or select neuromuscular diseases—regardless of age, capability, or ability to pay. Our camper-focused programming builds independence, confidence, and life skills through traditional camp activities and by bringing campers new experiences through adaptation, technology, creativity, and special guests.

#### Corvette de Olympia

In the summer of 2014, Anne Wax, President of Corvette de Olympia Car Club received a request from Camp Promise asking if the club could send some folks with their Corvettes up to Camp Promise for the "campers" (youth with DMD) to have the opportunity to see and sit in a Corvette and talk to the owners of their cars. Six members with their cars drove up to Camp Promise to spend a late afternoon and evening with the campers and staff. The excitement and smiles on the "campers" faces as they mingled amongst the cars is difficult to describe as the car owners watched with amazement at the enthusiasm of the "campers" expressing their gratitude to be able to have their picture taken near or sitting in a Corvette

This owner left Camp Promise absolutely awed by the impact these "campers" had on us as I realize they will probably never be able to own, let alone, drive a Corvette. Yet, I sensed their dreams had been fulfilled that afternoon just by our presence at Camp Promise.

I am grateful for the opportunity that was afforded to our club by Camp Promise. Probably the greatest reward to me personally was the request by Camp Promise for us to return in 2015 which we did and last night at our meeting to have a letter from Camp Promise read to us expressing their appreciation for our involvement and asking us to please consider returning again in 2016. I can hardly wait to return to Camp Promise!


