2017 NWACC Rules Change Submitted by: George Schwartz, NWACC Autocross Committee Chair

There are three (3) separate rules change proposals below. Clubs will need to vote separately on each proposal and bring the vote results to the February 11, 2017 NWACC Meeting.

#1

The proposed addition below will add a provision to the Speed Event Policies and Procedures Section A, Rule 14 that would require that a Approval form be completed at every NWACC-hosted or sanctioned autocross event. This form will be available at each event and must be signed by the NWACC club representatives present or by a NWACC club member who has entered the event.

Existing rule:

Section A – General Requirements

14 In the interest of safety, all courses should be designed to be as safe as possible. At any event, should a majority of drivers feel that a course is not safe, they should bring it to the attention of the Event Chairperson no later than the Driver's Meeting. It is the responsibility of the Event Chairperson to alter the course in such a manner as to provide a safe event.

Proposed addition (new paragraph):

The NWACC Course Approval Form must be completed prior to the start of the event runs. This form shall be made available by the Event Chair or his/her designee at the morning Driver's Meeting for signature approvals. The completed form shall be retained with all other event-specific documents.

#2

The proposed rule change below would change Section A, Rule 15 of the Speed Event Policies and Procedures. The current rule allows for 3 drivers per car but this would require that a dual-driver lane must be established at an event. At the Shelton event site currently used, there is limited space for Grid lanes and a dedicated dual- driver lane will put more cars into the remaining lanes and cause some congestion. Over the past few seasons, there has only been one 3-driver car entered. This change will also require dual drivers to be split into separate run groups.

Existing Rule 15:

There will be a maximum of three drivers per car. New rule 15:

There shall be a maximum of two drivers per car. Dual drivers are required to drive in separate run groups.

#3

The proposed new rule below will add a provision to the Speed Event Policies and Procedures Section A, that would prohibit a person from paying a second entry fee for the purpose of getting additional runs in either the same car or another car. Allowing a second entry would effectively keep that person from performing a task as required by the "work to run" provision.

New rule 29:





No person who has paid an entry fee at an event shall be allowed to pay a second entry fee where that entry would effectively allow additional runs using the same vehicle or a second vehicle. All entrants must be available to work and a second entry by a single person would keep them from this requirement. An entrant may pay the entry fee for a second driver using the same car.

Here's Chevy's Plan For The Mid-Engined 2017 'Corvette Zora'

GM's head of global product development, Mark Reuss, confirms that the company is working on the next Corvette. Our sources elaborate on this salient piece of information, telling us that, after 61 years of evolution, the C8 will be revolutionary.

The new Corvette will be the mid-engined American Dream Machine that Chevy couldn't, until now, muster the courage to build. In truth, the factory is still not prepared to detail what's coming, which is why you're looking at the 2017 model year through our freshly waxed crystal ball.

THE PLAN: The C8 flagship, the Zora ZR1, will debut the new mid-engine architecture. Launching as a 2017 model, it will define the top of the Corvette hierarchy just as its precursors did in 1990-1995 C4 generation and 2009-2013 C6 model years. As before, the ZR1 will be low volume, roughly 1500 units per annum, and high priced. We figure around \$150,000.
